Arlene Escanilla Azores, BSN Class 1994 after hearing about her recent completion of a Master of Science in Nursing Education from William Paterson University, Wayne, New Jersey. A few months ago, the USTNAI Board appointed her to the position of Recording Secretary which she has readily accepted because of her desire to be more engaged and involved in our Association. Below is a summary of her responses to the interview questions I've sent her. She was a little "under the weather", nevertheless she completed information that I've requested.

Graduating Cum Laude with a BSN degree in 1994 from the UST College of Nursing, her path towards practicing as a clinical nurse in the Philippines took a somewhat circuitous path prior to being hired by the Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital (RWJUH), Somerset, New Jersey. She relocated to the U.S with her husband (Dave) and with a 4 year old in tow (Austin) in 2004. Two years thereafter, they had another addition to the family, a girl named Dana. She has continued to practice at the RWJUH specializing in Maternal and Child Health.
